Expanded last year for first-time arrests, have a chance to not have record in system. Most important part is to hear the lessons and building relationships with kids. Kalo program. 25 people per month for 8 months. 5 lessons with parents. 3 weekends with parents, part of relationship building.

Update on HCTF meeting on July 22: Meeting is open to all Partners. Grant making and rebuilding trust fund are 2 key goals. RFP in Sept/Oct. MFSS will receive RFP and Edel will share with Core Partners. Need to demonstrate outcomes are achieved. Submit competitive grant.

Molokai Chapter of Ho'oikaika Partnership Workshop on August 4: Paul flies out monthly to Molokai on a consistent basis on the 1st Thursdays of each month. Took around 5 years to create Molokai coalition. Meetings are held at OHA. One of our grant deliverables is expansion of Ho'oikaika Partnership to the island of Molokai.
