



How Did You Hear About 'Ohana Fest? (n = 83)



Last year, a contest encouraged agencies to promote the 'Ohana Fest, resulting in 73 attendees (59%) being referred by an agency.


This year, without the contest, 32 attendees (39%) came through agency referrals.

About <u>135</u> agency staff and volunteers led activities such as:



"If there was a venue large enough to accommodate everyone inside with AC, that would be wonderful! It was hot."


"If culture was the focus of Ho'oikaika, then it should have been emphasized a little stronger so we can collectively work towards that goal as a whole."

Recommendations for Next Year

- More/earlier pre-event info shared
- Assigned spots or site map
- Expanded food options
- More signage
- Add water bottle stations near entrances
- Improve prize system
- Walkie talkies for co-chairs to improve coordination
- Improve registration process
- Improve family follow-up process
